## **4-H Club & Wilder Partner on Firewood Project**

GUNNISON-CRESTED BUTTE, Colo. (Nov. 5, 2019) — The Young Guns 4-H Club split and loaded three large truckloads of wood at Wilder on the Taylor, a historic ranch located along the Taylor River between Crested Butte and Gunnison, on Oct. 14 and Nov. 2, 2019. Several 4-H youth and parents and Wilder on the Taylor Ranch Manager Don Sabrowski and his crew members assisted, making it possible to deliver a total of 14 cords of wood to people needing a helping hand to stay warm this winter.

“Community service is a yearly requirement for staying active in 4-H. It is near and dear to my heart, and I want to teach 4-H kids the true meaning of giving of themselves and their time for others to benefit,” says Shelly Sabrowski, who manages the ranch with Don and is the longtime volunteer leader of the Young Guns.

Not only is the project providing firewood, it’s helping Wilder with fire mitigation by removing dead trees.
